## **President's Report**

Members of the Club, Ladies and Gentlemen,

On behalf of the Murrumbeena Cricket Club Committee, it gives me great pleasure to present to you the 2023/24 Annual Report and Balance Sheet for your consideration and adoption.

What an amazing season!! Season 2023/24 was one of remarkable on field success for the Murrumbeena Cricket Club, with three senior premierships and two junior premierships, making it a historic season for us.

The 1st XI had an outstanding 2023/24 season under the leadership of captain Alex Ross. The team welcomed new players Arshaan Jasani, Nic Cowling, Kunj Desai and Adam Fraine who all made significant contributions to the team throughout the season. After losing the first match of the season to Carnegie, the team put together a string of wins and was on top of the ladder with 4 matches to go in the season. This is when the season took a turn, 3 losses in the last 4 matches saw them fall to 3rd place and book themselves an away semi-final against Parkdale United. Murrumbeena needed to turn the tables on Parkdale United who had won the last match comfortably by bowling us out for 55. Batting first on a hot day Beena put up a competitive score of 233 thanks to a gutsy and ultimately match winning 98 off 211 balls from veteran Brett Hardham with good support from Will Kelly (55). The Parkdale United chase got off to a good start and they looked in control at 3-136, but with 56.5 overs of spin and 8-139 combined from Adam Fraine (6/71) and Tej Gandhi (2/68) Beena managed to wrestle control of the match back and win by 39 runs. The Grand Final away against McKinnon was one of the most competitive and nerve wracking matches I have ever watched. Batting first, Beena was in trouble at 5/69, but a captain's knock of 57 off 132 balls from Alex Ross got the innings back on track. Contributions of 26 from Xavier Ross and 19\* from Adam Fraine to go with Cooper Anstee's 33 at the top of the order meant Beena was able to scratch together a total of 173. It seemed to be under par for the ground and wicket but, as always, runs on the board are worth their weight in gold, especially in Grand Finals. All the bowlers worked extremely hard but did not get the rewards and at 2/101 McKinnon looked in the box seat to win the match. But the entire Beena team stayed upbeat, kept the buzz in the field and as every wicket fell the pressure on the McKinnon players grew. Tej Gandhi (man of the match) bowled gallantly all day ending up with figures of 6/68 off 30.5 overs and bowled Beena to victory and back into Championship division. An amazing effort from the entire team and I could not be prouder of the resilience shown by the whole team in both the semi and grand finals. An amazing day for all the players and supporters.

Zane Goold again took the reins of the 2nd XI as we welcomed some new and old faces into the team. Parth Shah joined from Carnegie and Matthew Williams made his return to the playing field after many years on the sideline. With a good mix of youth and experience the team played well throughout the season and finished the regular season 2nd on the table. The home semi-final against Carnegie unfortunately did not go to plan. Bowling first Beena dismissed Carnegie for 177, which looked under par on a flat deck at Beena with a fast outfield. Unfortunately, this proved not to be the case. Some poor batting from the top order saw Beena on the ropes at 5/77. Jimmy Handley batted cautiously and compiled 65 not out off 114, but ultimately, he ran out of partners with the score on 168. A 9-run loss was a disappointing end to the season for the 2nd XI, but with some significant improvement from some of the younger members the team will look to improve next season and win that elusive flag.

Aidan Ross led the 3rd XI to premiership glory with a perfect blend of young talent and experienced players. The team played good consistent cricket throughout the season with evergreen Leigh Hardham leading the way with the bat and Charlie Lloyd and Lachie Carter leading the wicket takers. After a solid team effort defeating Cheltenham by 30 runs in the semi-final, a grand-final on the Beena main ground against Aspendale beckoned. The match got off to a quick start thanks to James Lockhart who did the bulk of the scoring in an 88-run opening stand with Aidan Ross. James Lockhart was later dismissed for a well compiled 98 runs, falling agonisingly short of a hundred. Some more solid contributions from the middle and lower order saw the team bat out the 80 overs to put up a strong score of 9/274. A perfect start to our bowling innings saw Liam Anstee taking a wicket with just the second ball of the day. Wickets fell regularly and Aspendale fell to 5/60, but a 6th wicket partnership of 78 started to bring the game back onto level terms. Lachie Carter and Charlie Lloyd dismissed the two set batsmen and wickets then began to fall. Aspendale all out for 192, an 82-run win for the Murrumbeena 3rd XI and a deserved man of the match award to James Lockhart for his 98.

Sri Thangaraju once again captained the 4th XI with hopes of securing the premiership that has so far eluded him as skipper. The team once again had a fantastic home and away season finishing the season 2nd on the ladder. A strong win over Parkdale in the semi-final meant they needed to travel to rivals Middle Park for the grand final. Unfortunately, the team was not able to play their best cricket on the day and was comfortably beaten by Middle Park. Another great season from the team and I am sure they will come back again next year to hopefully win that premiership they have been working so hard for.

The Club put together a 5th XI for the first time in many years and Prayank Gupta put his hand up to lead the team. He did a fantastic job as captain and worked extremely well with the young junior players Kady D'Aulerio, Luke Yankov and Giorgi Tragomalis who played throughout the season. A slow start to the season turned around and the team managed to work their way up to 3rd place on the table and play off in a semifinal against Parkdale United. Unfortunately, the team was unable to bring its best form on the day and was knocked out of the finals. A fantastic effort from Prayank and the team and so pleasing from a Club point of view to have 5 teams once again on Saturday.

The Club welcomed back Jag Gill and he led our Sunday team. It was the first time we have had a Sunday team for some years, playing in the CSB Division 1 Sunday competition. Jag combined new players he brought to the Club as well as some existing club players and the team had a fantastic season. They finished the season 4th and accounted for Hampton in the semi-final. The team advanced to the grand final which they played away against Emmanuel South Oakleigh. Well supported by many Club members, the team were able to post a competitive score of 128 batting first. Some tight bowling and pressure in the field meant that Murrumbeena bowled Emmanuel out for 64. A fantastic day for the players and supporters in attendance.

The junior program was once again expertly overseen by our junior coordinator Mark Langham and his hard-working junior committee. We were able to field 15 junior teams across 5 different age groups including our U14 girls' team. It was an extremely successful season on field for the juniors with 3 teams making it through to Grand Finals and two teams winning the Premiership cup. One of the many highlights of the season being the Grand Final between our two U13B teams (Ward & Naulls). An extremely close fought match played in great spirit between the two teams. We also had a busy Woolworths Cricket Blast program which ran smoothly thanks to the help of Simon Croxford and his many parent helpers.

I want to extend my deepest gratitude to our major sponsors: Bailey Timms Lawyers, Gary Peer Real Estate, and Unique Collision. Your unwavering support has been crucial to our success, and we are sincerely thankful for your continued commitment. I also want to acknowledge and thank all our local sponsors and player sponsors for their support.

## **Financial Report**

## **Alan Graham 1947-2023**

It is with much sadness we report the passing of Alan Graham, a Life Member and stalwart of the club. His contributions both on and off the field were a major factor in shaping the club as we know it today.

A local Murrumbeena lad, Alan played his first game for the club in 1958, graduated to senior cricket in 1963/64, and with the exception of two seasons in National Service, played continuously until retiring following the 1982/83 Season. There were some cameo appearances in lower XI's in later years. AG was a formidable player in a successful First XI era, playing 175 matches in the 1st XI in sixteen seasons.

He bowled fastish off-spin, claiming 325 First XI wickets, and was a handy batsman, scoring a First XI century in 1965/66, and another in a rare appearance in the Second XI in 1972/73. He was an outstanding fieldsman who had the knack of turning a game through his brilliance in the field. Alan was a three-time First XI premiership player, winning two of his three bowling averages in premiership years. His exceptional career was acknowledged when he was honoured and selected as member of the Murrumbeena Team of the Century.

Alan was an accomplished administrator and served on the committee for 13 years, seven as Social Secretary and six as Secretary. He was awarded life membership in 1977/78. After retirement he continued to support the club providing guidance and encouragement. He also coordinated the distribution and sale of special effort tickets to past players for many years.

He was also gifted footballer, joining Ormond Amateur Football Club straight out of Under 17 football, where after just 2 games in the Under 19s he was promoted directly to the Firsts. He went on to play in three Ormond premierships and represented Victoria in a number of interstate matches in the 1970s.

Alan will be sadly missed. Our sincere condolences go to Margaret, Claire, Simon and families.

## **Competition**

The club fielded six senior teams in the Cricket Southern Bayside; Three 2-day teams competed in Divisions 1, 3 and 5, while three 1-day teams played in Divisions 6 and 8, plus Sunday Division 1 (considered our 6th XI). We also entered a team in the CSB T20 competition.

The 1st and 2nd XIs played their home games at Peter Robertson Oval, Kangaroo Road, Murrumbeena; the 3rd and 4th XIs played at Glen Huntly Park, corner Booran and Neerim Roads, Glen Huntly; the 5th XI played on a synthetic wicket at Caulfield Park/Oval 5, while the 6th XI used Peter Robertson Oval.

The club fielded 13 junior teams in the Inner South East Cricket competition: one Under 17, two Under 15, four Under 13 and seven Under 11 teams. We also fielded a team in the All Girls Cricket Competition, Under 14 grade.

Junior home grounds were spread across Murrumbeena Park (U17 and U15 turf, U13 and U11 synthetic), Glen Huntly Park (U15 turf) and Duncan Mackinnon (U13 and U11). The All Girls team played their home games at Duncan Mackinnon.

We are grateful to Glen Eira Council for allowing us use of all the grounds we used and for the preparation of the turf wickets.

## First Eleven Report

CAPTAIN: Alex Ross

VICE-CAPTAIN Will Kelly

After a disappointing 2022/23 season, Murrumbeena looked to 2023/24 as a great opportunity to get back up to Championship Division with our first season back in Division 1 since 2019/20.

After a rain affected Round 1, our season kicked off against cross-town rivals Carnegie, who had finished on top of the ladder last season. We went into the match full of confidence, with 3 debutants, Carnegie batted first and got to a very competitive score of 205. Our best bowlers were young pair Jack Anstee (2/29) and Kunj Desai (3/55). Our run chase started strong with Alex Hay (42), Tej Gandhi (39), and Will Kelly (36) all getting starts but ultimately Murrumbeena lost by 24 runs.

We then faced Dingley away, batted first and were under pressure in the first powerplay being 3/20. A top scoring Tej Gandhi (58), shared partnerships with Will Kelly (29), and Alex Ross (41\*) and took us to a competitive score of 171. Early wickets with the new ball put Dingley on the backfoot for the whole innings, a strong team bowling performance secured our first win for the year, bowling out Dingley for 115, a bonus point victory. Troy Ryan (3/7) led the way with Jack Anstee (2/30) providing support and Tej Gandhi (2/11) completing a man of the match performance.

Our new recruits set up back-to-back victories, beating Brighton District by 6 wickets. Kunj Desai (3/28) bowled exceptionally well in the middle order, with Troy Ryan (2/16) and Dan Parkinson (2/31) also having a great day to restrict Brighton District to 153. Nic Cowling (66) was our anchor in the top order with Tej Gandhi (34\*) and Arshaan Jasani (22) playing great supportive roles.

Murrumbeena then found itself in a top of the table clash against rivals McKinnon. We batted first and found ourselves in big trouble at 5/35. Tej Gandhi (36) again held our top order together, with Xavier Ross (17) supporting a big partnership to get us to 5/88, but the tail collapsed to be all out for 102. Early wickets were key and that is what our new ball bowlers provided. Troy Ryan (6/18) with his best match for the club to date, ripping through McKinnon's side. Jack Anstee (2/20) and Dan Parkinson (2/3) getting amongst the wickets too to bowl McKinnon out for an astonishing 42.

Looking to keep the momentum going, we played South Caulfield Seconds away in round 6. The return of Brett Hardham (30) was crucial, opening the batting and seeing off the new ball. Tej Gandhi (63) and Xavier Ross (29) for the second consecutive week bonding for a crucial partnership to take us from 4/83 to 5/162.



Murrumbeena finished with a very competitive score of 179. Regular wickets throughout our bowling innings never gave South Caulfield a chance, with multiple contributors with the ball. Tej Gandhi (3/17) and Troy Ryan (2/16) leading the way, bowling very economically. Dan Parkinson (1/19) bowled a gutsy spell on one leg, and Adam Fraine (1/25) took a wicket on debut.

We faced Parkdale United at home to round out the white ball cricket for the season. Brett Hardham (45) again getting us off to a great start, but it was the game changing 7th wicket partnership that saw us to a nailbiting 17 run victory. Will Kelly (45\*) and Kunj Desai (18\*) put on 60 runs unbeaten to end the innings. At 3/94 in reply, Parkdale United looked set to win but spin kings Adam Fraine (3/31) and Tej Gandhi (1/34) broke the game open. Troy Ryan (3/16) and Jack Anstee (2/19) finished off the tail to round out the one dayers on a 5 game winning streak.

Into two day cricket, we played Parkdale away. We bowled first and never gave Parkdale a chance. Tej Gandhi (4/14), Kunj Desai (3/18) and Troy Ryan (2/21) all having excellent spells to bowl out Parkdale for 72. We chased their total on Day 1 with Tej Gandhi (77) and Xavier Ross (30) getting us to 6/153 before rain affected our opportunity at outright victory.

Rain also affected the first day of our clash with Carnegie, with the second day becoming a one dayer. Carnegie made 193, with Kunj Desai (2/46) bowling a crucial spell to end the innings. In reply, Will Kelly (77\*) steered us to victory in a thrilling run chase to win with 1 over to spare. Murrumbeena headed into the Christmas break top of the ladder 7-1-1, having beaten all seven opposition teams in succession.

A draw and back-to-back losses kicked off 2024. A rain affected match against Dingley resulted in a draw, then relegation-bound Brighton District chased down our 174 in an exciting match, before a top of the table clash against McKinnon ended in a 31 run defeat and dropping from top-place on the ladder.

Looking to gain momentum in February. We played South Caulfield in a crucial clash. After bowling them out for 152 with all bowlers getting amongst the wickets, our young stars in Cooper Anstee (76), Arshaan Jasani (60) and Xavier Ross (58) made light work of South Caulfield's bowling attack.

Our final game of the season was away to Parkdale United, playing for 2nd place and a home final. Murrumbeena was bowled out for 55 before Parkdale United made 264, and dropped to third on the ladder.

Into finals for the first time since 2019/20, Murrumbeena was eager to go all the way. We were back at Parkdale United again. Batting first, Brett Hardham (98) and Will Kelly (55) put together a match-defining partnership in scorching heat. Tej Gandhi (38) and Adam Fraine (17) were the backbone of the middle order to be bowled out for 233. Parkdale United battled away to threaten our imposing total being 3/136, before Adam Fraine put the team on his back to bowl 29 consecutive overs in 38\* heat. Fraine ultimately finished with 6/71, a maiden 5 wicket haul in the first eleven. Tej Gandhi also bowled with great courage, bowling 27 overs for 2/68. We bowled out Parkdale United for 194 to win a thrilling semi-final.

Up against McKinnon at their ground in the Grand Final, Murrumbeena batted first on a good looking deck. 18 year old Cooper Anstee batted patiently to see off the new ball and make 33. A few quick wickets saw us go from 1/44 to 5/69, before brothers Alex Ross and Xavier Ross came together to put the brakes on McKinnon's charge. Xavier was bowled for 26 when we were 125, before Alex was dismissed for 57. Adam Fraine (19\*) dug through with the tail, to get us to 173. In reply, McKinnon looked set at tea being 2/101, before a warhorse spell from Troy Ryan (2/48 from 20 overs) brought us right back into the contest with them now 6/120. ## Second Eleven Report

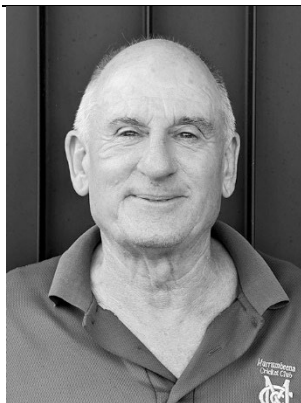

The Fourth XI carried their strong performance from the last 5 seasons and finished in second place on the ladder. ## Historian's Report

The club has not previously won **three senior premierships** in a season, and when the two Under 13 flags are added, the total of **five** is also unprecedented. Equally, this is the first time we have had six senior teams competing in the finals – we had five in 1948/49 and four teams a few times, but only in 1928/29 and 2007/08 did we have 4 out of 4 teams play in the finals.

**Leigh Hardham** extended his club records for number of runs scored and total number of games played, and also now has the most number of batting averages won at the club, 20. Leigh reached milestones of 16,000 club runs, and 15,000 senior runs, and completed his twelfth century; he has now scored one in each decade he has played – 1960s through 2020s – which is quite remarkable.

During the season **Cooper Anstee** and **Arshaan Jasani** put together an opening partnership of 171 in the Second XI. Both were promoted, and they compiled another 100 opening partnership next match in the Firsts XI. This is the only time I have found a pair making successive 100 partnerships in two different teams. And while on the subject of multiples, **Jagvir Gill** has become the first player to win averages in two teams in a season.

**Congratulations** to **Jarrold Martin** on reaching the 5,000 run milestone, and to **Zane Goold** for getting to 3,000 senior runs. With the ball **Veeral Mehta** reached the 200 wicket milestone. **Shriman Adapa** played his 100th Junior game, while **Sridharan Thangaraju** and **Karthik Padmanabhan** each reached 100 senior games.

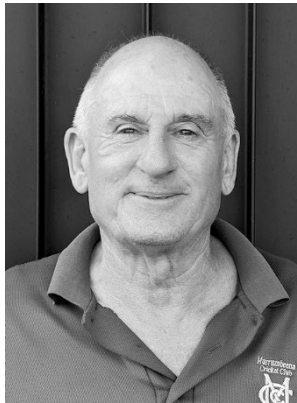
